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Instead, we find the Seneca of the major treatises, *De Ira*, *De Beneficiis*, *Natural Questions* and of the *Moral Epistles* a man deeply committed to rational inquiry and deserving at least a modicum of the critical attention we give to Aristotle or Augustine. Inwood is responsive to features of Seneca's Latinity and of his handling of the Greek tradition that set him apart from Cicero, and is capable of capturing subtle changes of conception that occur when Greek terms e.
